WHEREAS, since President Theodore Roosevelt proposed to extend United States Cirizenship to the residents of Puerto Rico in 1905, which Congress conferred in 1917, the United States Citizens of Puerto Rico have been contributing immeasurably to the Nation in cultural, social, economic, and political terms, with thousands of them valiantly serving in every military conflict in which our Nation has engaged in this century.

WHEREAS. Congress has plenary powers over Puerto Rico pursuant to the Territorial Clause of the United States Constitution, and accordingly it can expand, after, or replace the local constitutional self-government authorized for Puerto Rico in 1950 and therafter conditionally approved by Congress in 1952.

WHEREAS, under the present limited local self-government, the 3.8 million American citizens who reside in Puerto Rico cannot vote for the President of the United States and their only representative in Congress has no voting power on the Floor of the House. The residents of Puerto Rico have not been extended the same obligations and benefits and duties and responsibilities under Federal law as the rest of the citizens of the Union.
