Duar Hr. Chairman:

I read your letter regarding Guan's commonwealth stetus with great interest, and I share many of the positions you expressed in your wall-reasoned analysis.

Recently I not with the Governor of Guan to discuss the pace and direction of the hagotiations. We agreed on the need to move quickly to resolve several key questions involving the territory's political status. As you point out in your letter, the issues are complex and sensitive. I am aware of Guan's aspirations for self-government. At the same time, we must satisfy federal concerns at the policy, legislative and constitutional levels.

I am prepared to provide sustained attention from the Executive Branch to these negotiations. A successful outcome requires coordination among many agencies and extensive computations with Congress. I look forward to working with you and your colleagues in the coming months as we move the Guam issue toward a conclusion that will be satisfactory to all involved.
